Personal History

William BAILLIE was born at Openshaw, Manchester in 1893 the son of Walter and Sarah Ann BAILLIE nee FODDY who were married 1892 at Chorlton-on-Medlock, Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1915. His mother died in 1915.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 14, Bush Street, Newton Heath, Manchester,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 2, St. Augustine Street, Harpurhay. Mancgester,. He was aged 7 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Head Office as a Clerk

Service History

He was living at Manchester, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Manchester Regiment. and embarked for France on 8 November 1915. His last known address was Manchester, Newton Heath, Bush Street, 14 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 23 January 1916 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
