

## Private Harry HARRISON

7508 1st Battalion 'B' Company Black Watch (73rd Highlanders)

Killed in action 15 September 1914 aged 31

## Personal History

Harry HARRISON was born at Burnley, Lancashire in 1882 the son of Thomas and Margaret Ellen HARRISON nee GRAY who were married 05/06/1879 at St. Peter, Burnley, Lancashire. His mother died in 1911.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 34, Brunswick Street, Horwich. Lancashire,. He was aged 28. Labourer Railway Company

In the 1891 census the family were living at 30, Newcastle Street. Burnley, Lancashire,. He was aged 9 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Elizabeth HARRISON (nee ATTWOOD) They married at St. Cartherine, Horwich, Lancashire on 25 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Labourer

## Service History

He enlisted in the Black Watch (73rd Highlanders) at Burnley, Lancashire. and embarked for on 13 August 1914. His last known address was Horwich, Brunswick Street, 34 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 15 September 1914 aged 31

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
