Personal History

Albert HARTLEY was born at Cragg Vale, Yorkshire on 26 August 1887 the son of Joe and Mary Ann HARTLEY nee CLEGG who were married 07/05/1887 at St. John in the Wilderness, Cragg Vale, Yorkshire. His father died in 1923. His mother died in 1923.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 10, Turvis, Cragg Vale, Mytholmroyd, Yorkshire,. He was aged 23 with the occupation of Cotton Twinner.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Banks Bottom, Mytjhomroyd, Yorkshire,. He was aged 13 with the occupation of Cotton Twinner.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Platelayer

He enlisted in the Royal Engineers at Hebden Bridge, Yorkshire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 27 March 1918 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
