Personal History

Joseph Leigh HARTLEY was born at Rochdale, Lancashire in 1883 the son of James and Ruth HARTLEY nee RYCROFT who were married 28/02/1874 at Parish Church, Trawden, Lancashire. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 11, Alice Street, Rochdale, Lancashire,. He was aged 28 with the occupation of Carter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 26, Calder Street, Rochdale,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Woollen Piece Hooker.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 10, Back Heybrook Lane Weurdle & Wardle, Rochdale, Lancashire,. He was aged 9 Scholar

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Platelayer

Service History

He was living at Rochdale, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Cheshire Regiment at the same place. on 19 February 1915

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 29 April 1918 aged 35

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
