Personal History

Albert HASKAYNE was born at Melling, Liverpool. Lancashire in 1890 the son of Charles and Mary HASKAYNE nee FARRINGTON who were married 1878 at West Derby Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1916. His mother died in 1916.

In the 1911 census the family were living at School Lane, Aintree, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Carter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Brewery Lane Cott. He was aged s with the occupation of Melling, Liverpool, Age 10.

In the 1891 census the family were living at Brewery Lane Cott. He was aged s with the occupation of Melling, Liverpool, Age 9 months.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Fazakerley as a Striker

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Seafortth, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 19 May 1915. His last known address was Melling, Brewery Lane, 6 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 19 August 1916 aged 26

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
