Personal History

Frank HASLAM was born at Irlam-O'th Heights, Lancashire in 1896 the son of James William and Phoebe HASLAM nee PERKS who were married 16/09/1891 at Christ Church, Pendlebury, Lancashire. His father died in 1951. His mother died in 1951.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 21, Ruth Street, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Scholar.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 274, Bolton Road, Pendleton, Lancashire,. He was aged 5 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Labourer

He was living at Bolton, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Scots Guards at the same place.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 1 September 1916 in France aged 20
