Personal History

Frank HATTON was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1875 the son of William and Ellen HATTON nee WOOLVEN who were married 05/09/1870 at Manchester Cathedral.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 5, Bridgewater Street, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 36 with the occupation of Cab Driver.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Blackburn as a Porter

Service History

He was living at Blackburn, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Kings's Royal Rifles at Burnley, Lancashire. on 8 December 1903 and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 22 August 1914. His last known address was Backburn, Ashton Street, 5 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 11 October 1914 in France aged 39

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
