Personal History

John HAWKINS was born at Knottingley, Yorkshire in 1895 the son of John Pakinson and Mary Ann HAWKINS nee CHAPEL who were married 10/11/1877 at St Oswald, Methley, Yorkshire. His father died on . In the 1911 census the family were living at Womersley Road, Knottingley, Yorkshire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Labourer, Yeat Presser, Brewery.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Womersley Road, Knottingley, Yorkshire,. He was aged 6 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Knottingley as a Joint Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Scots Regiment at Leeds, Yorkshire. on 24 April 1915 and embarked for France on 11 August 1915. His last known address was Knottingley, Yorkshire, Womersley Road, (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 16 September 1917 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
