Personal History

Robert HINDLE was born at Preston, Lancashire in 1891 the son of Alexander and Elizabeth Ann HINDLE nee SHACKLETON who were married 1874 at St. John, Preston, Lancashire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 50, Gillet Street, Preston Lancashire,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Labourer Saw Mills.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 25, Young Street, Preston, Lancashire,. He was aged 10 In the 1891 census the family were living at 25, Young Street, Preston, Lancashire,. He was aged 26 Days Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Preston as a Washer

Service History

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Preston, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 25 December 1915. His last known address was Preston, Gillet Street, 12 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 2 January 1916 in 24th Gen Hosp., Etaples, France aged 25 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
