## Personal History

Harry HODGKINSON was born at Pendleton, Lancashire on 22 April 1892 the son of John Henry and Millicent HODGKINSON nee HAYNES who were married 1888 at St. James, Wardleworth, Lancashire. His father died in 1910. His mother died in 1910.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 25, Temperance Place, Pendleton, Lancashire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Railway Train Booker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 2. Tindall Street, Pendleton, Lancashire,. He was aged 8 He was a married man. His wife's name was Mary Jane HODGKINSON (nee OGDEN) They married at St. Paul, Pendleton, Lancashire on 18 December 1915

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Littleborough as a Signalman

## Service History

He enlisted in the (Manchester Regt.) Lancashire Fusiliers. and embarked for France on 15 July 1915. His last known address was Pendleton, Chapel Street, 26 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 9 September 1918 aged 26

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
