Frank HODGSON was born at Salford, Lancashire on 12 November 1897 the son of Frank and Hannah HODGSON nee DEAN who were married 1894 at St. Clements, Salford, Lancashire. His father died on . He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Salford, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 24 July 1915. His last known address was Pendleton, Knowles Street, 11 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 8 April 1918 in 4th London General Hospital aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
