Personal History

Harold HODGSON was born at Bradford, Yorkshire in 1894 the son of Thomas and Hannah HODGSON nee BROWNBRIDGE who were married 04/12/1883 at St. James, Bolton, Yorkshire. His father died in 1902. His mother died in 1902.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Mayfield, Ne Thope, Pontefract, Yorkshire.. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Cowman on Farm.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 17, Mount Street, Eccleshill, Shipley, Dyorkshire,. He was aged 7 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Bradford as a Reserve Shunter

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Bradford, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 12 July 1915. His last known address was Bradford, Yorkshire, Undercliffe Street, 197 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 16 October 1917 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
