Personal History

Douglas Sacre HODGSON-JONES was born at Manchester, Lancashire on 22 August 1895 the son of Rev. Philip and Ethel HODGSON-JONES nee SACRE who were married 1890 at Sty. Paul, Kersal, Salford, Lancashire. His father died in 1908. His mother died in 1908.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Kersal Field, 6, Vine Street, Broughton, Salford,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Scholar.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 276, Great Cheetham Street, Broughton, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 6

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Pupil

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Engineers. and embarked for France on 14 November 1915. His last known address was Salford, Broughton, Vine Street, 6, Kersal Field (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died at home on 13 February 1919 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
