He enlisted in the Royal Engineers at Manchester, Lancashire. on 4 September 1914 and embarked for France on 28 August 1915. His last known address was Harpurhey, Manchester, Queens Road, Husband Street, 159 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 12 February 1917 aged 27

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
