Personal History

Percy HOLDEN was born at Bolton, Lancashire in 1894 the son of Alfred and Ellen HOLDEN nee HOUGH who were married 29/06/1889 at St. George, Bolton, Lancashire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 51, Catherine Street East, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Cotton Piecer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 23, Catherine Street East, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 6 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Labourer

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Horwich. Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 29 April 1917 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
