Personal History

James HOLLINGHURST was born at Preston Lancashire in 1895 the son of Henry and Jane HOLLINGHURST nee TAYLOR who were married 1890 at Preston Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1950. His mother died in 1950.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 22, Catherine Street East, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Machinist in Fitters Shop.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 10, Catherine Street East, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 6 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Shaper

Service History

He was living at Horwich, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at the same place. on 17 August 1914 and embarked for France on 4 May 1915. His last known address was Horwich, Catherine Street East, 22 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 15 June 1915 aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
