In the 1901 census the family were living at Church Street, Croston, Preston,. He was aged 9 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Platelayer

He enlisted in the Royal Garrison Artillery at Croston, Lancashire. He is recorded as Killed in action on 29 April 1918 aged 26 He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
