Personal History

Harry HORNBY was born at Horwich, Lancashire in 1892 the son of James and Ann Maria HORNBY. His father died in 1926. His mother died in 1926.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 3, Top o'th Wallsuchas, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Parceller at Bleachworks.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 3, Top o'th Wallsuchas, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 8 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Stores Dept. at Horwich as a Clerk

Service History

He was living at Horwich, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at the same place. on 10 September 1914 and embarked for France on 24 September 1915. His last known address was Horwich, Top o'th Wallsuchas, 3 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 21 May 1916 aged 24

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
