

Private Frank HOULT

2555 1st/4th Battalion King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry Died of Wounds 29 July 1916 aged 19

Personal History

Frank HOULT was born at Knottingley, Yorshire in 1897 the son of William Henry and Anne Elizabeth HOULT nee HOULT who were married 29/04/1893 at St. James with Christ Church, Thornes, Yorkshire. His father died in 1942. His mother died in 1942.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 54, New Brunsswick Street, Thornes Lane, Wakefield, Yorkshire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Millhand.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Lower Rope Walk, Knottingley, Yorkshire. He was aged 5 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Wakrfield as a Cleaner

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry at Wakefield, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 13 April 1915. His last known address was Sandal, Wakefield, Portobello East, Clifford View, 22 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 29 July 1916 aged 19

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
