Personal History

Jesse (James) HOWARD was born at Ashton Under Lyne, Lancashire in 1895 the son of Percy and Amanda HOWARD nee GREENWOOD who were married 11/10/1890 at St. Peter, Ashton Under Lyne, Lancashire. His father died in 1920. His mother died in 1920.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 7, Robert Street, Dukinfield,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Riveter at Railway Works.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 45, Margaret Street, Ashton Under Lyne, Lancashire,. He was aged 8

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Boiler Makers Assistant

Service History

He was living at Dukinfield, Cheshire when he enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Ashton Under Lyne, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 7 May 1917 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
