Personal History

James HOWARTH was born at Radcliffe, Lancashire in 1894 the son of William and Lydia HOWARTH nee PITFIELD who were married 03/06/1882 at St. Andrew, Radcliffe, Lancashire. His mother died in 1933. In the 1911 census the family were living at 54, Cross Lane, Radcliffe, Manchester, Lancashire, He was aged 16 with the occupation of Grocery Store Porter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 177, Ainsworth Road, Radcliffe, Lancashire,. He was aged 6 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Radcliffe as a Reserve Shunter

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Bury, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
