Personal History

William ALDERSHAW was born at Ancoats, Manchester, Lancashire in 1883 the son of Thomas ALDERSHAW.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 70, Lowe Street, Miles Platting, Manchester,. He was aged 28 with the occupation of Wagon Lifter.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Hannah ALDERSHAW (nee ROBERTS) They married at St. Lukes Miles Platting, Manchester on 21 March 1905. They had children: Clara b. 1908

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Newton Heath as a Lifter

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Lancaster Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 23 August 1914. His last known address was Manchester, Miles Platting Lowe Street, 70 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 15 September 1914 aged 31

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
