Personal History

Edward HOYLE was born at Burnley, Lancashire in 1879 the son of James and Mary HOYLE nee PILKINGTON who were married 1875 at Burnley Register Office or Registrar Attended . His father died in 1896. His mother died in 1896.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 2, Haslam Streetm Burnley, Lancashire,. He was aged 31 with the occupation of Cotton Weaver.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 8, Scarlett Street, Burnley,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Cotton Weaver.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 97, Reed Street, Habergham Eaves, Burnley, Lancashire,. He was aged 11 with the occupation of Cotton Weaver.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Rhoda HOYLE (nee HARTLEY) They married at Burnley Register Office or Registrar Attended on 12 March 1905. They had children: James b. 1898

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Rose Gate as a Platelayer

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Burnley, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 25 November 1917 aged 38

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
