Personal History

Wilfred HOYLE was born at Huddersfield, Yorkshire in 1887 the son of Walter and Agnes HOYLE nee HITCH who were married 26/04/1886 at Huddersfield, Yorkshire. His father died in 1958. His mother died in 1958.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Canadar Military Barracks, South Tedworth, Hants,. He was aged 24 with the occupation of (named as Hill).

In the 1901 census the family were living at 18, High Street, Paddock, Huddersfield, Yorkshire.. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Cotton Spinner.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 45. Luck Lane, Marsh, Huddersfield, Yorkshire,. He was aged 4 with the occupation of Scholar.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Sowerby Bridge as a Labourer

Service History

He was living at Huddersfield, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the West Riding Regiment at Milnsbridge, Yorkshire. on 9 December 1915 and embarked for France on 17 January 1917. His last known address was Huddersfield, Paddock, Beech Street, 49 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 11 August 1917 aged 31

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
