Personal History

Harry HUCKERBY was born at Poulten-le-Fylde, Lancashire in 1894 the son of Harmond Armstead (Frank) and Elizabeth Gott HUCKERBY nee CAWOOD who were married 1883 at Barnsley, Yorkshire. His father died in 1946. His mother died in 1946.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 8, Culshaw Street, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Railway Train Booker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 62, Audley Range, Blackburn, Lancvashire,. He was aged 7 He was a married man. His wife's name was Leah HUCKERBY (nee MARSDEN) They married at St, Thomas, Blackburn, Lancashire on 31 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Black Watch (Royal Highlanders) at Blackburn, Lancashire. He is recorded as Killed in action on 12 December 1917 aged 24

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
