Personal History

Harry BARDSLEY was born at Bolton, Lancashire in 1896 the son of George Edward and Sarah BARDSLEY nee JONES who were married 1889 at Holy Trinity, Bolton Le Moors. His father died in 1916. His mother died in 1916.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 91. Grasmore Street, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Cotton Piecer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 78, Rawsthorne Street, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 5
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at
Bolton as a Fireman

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Bolton, Lancashire. and embarked for Egypt on 25 September 1914. His last known address was Bolton, Grasmere Street, 91 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 11 September 1917 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
