Personal History

Albert INCE was born at Chorley, Lancashire in 1881 the son of James and Rachel INCE nee BAXENDALE who were married 24/09/1868 at St. Paul, Alingtom, Lancashire. His father died in 1896. His mother died in 1896.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 12, William Street, Chorley, Lancashire,. He was aged 29 with the occupation of Railway General Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 93, Lyons Lane, Chorley, Lancashire,. He was aged 19 with the occupation of Private Lancashire Fusiliers.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 61, Cowling Road, Chorley, Lancashire,. He was aged 9 He was a married man. His wife's name was Mary Helen INCE (nee TWIST) They married at Chorley Register Office or Registrar Attended on 24 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Boiler Coverer

Service History

He was living at Chorley, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Bury, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 4 December 1914. His last known address was Chorley, William Street, 12, 1911 Census

He is recorded as Killed in action on 12 October 1916 aged 34

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
