Personal History

Robert ISHERWOOD was born at Bolton, Lancashire on 28 April 1889 the son of Thomas Kearsley and Margaret Alice ISHERWOOD nee PENDLEBURY who were married 14/12/1882 at St. Stephen, Lever Bridge, Bolton, Lancashire. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 208, Crescent Road, Great Lever, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 14, Clayton Street, Great Bolton, Bolton, He was aged 12 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Radcliffe as a Clerk

He was living at Bolton, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Royal Engineers at St. Helens, Lancashire. He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 30 March 1917 in North Mid Casualty Clearing Stn. aged 28 He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
