***Personal History***

*William ISHERWOOD was born at Southport, Lancashire in 1891 the son of William and Ann ISHERWOOD nee BERRY who were married 1880 at St. George, Bolton, Lancashire. His father died in 1915. His mother died in 1915.*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 1, Hawthorn Grove, Southport, Lancashire,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Railway Porter.*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 78, Bispham Road, Southport, Lancashire,. He was aged 10 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Sperintendent of the Line Dept. at St. Lukes as a Porter*

***Service History***

*He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Southpoert, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 14 December 1915. His last known address was Southport, Lancashire, Blair Grove, 8 (CWGC).*

*He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 2 June 1918 aged 27*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star*
