Personal History

Hugh Lawrence JACKSON was born at Horwich, Bolton, Lancashire in 1893 the son of Henry Riley and Annie Maria JACKSON nee BOWEN who were married 1885 at Birmingham, Warwickshire. His father died in 1907. His mother died in 1907.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Fitter

He was living at Horwich, Bolton, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Royal Engineers at Bolton, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 28 August 1915. His last known address was Preston, New Longton, Hollybrook, Lancashire (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 14 May 1916 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
