Personal History

Harry JENNINGS was born at Newton, Manchester on 22 November 1893 the son of William Frederick and Ellen JENNINGS nee WHITLOCK who were married 22/09/1880 at St. Andrew, Bordsley, Warwickshire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 11/13 Ridgeway Street, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Page Boy, Clarion Club.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 3, Horne Place, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 8

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Newton Heath as a Cleaner

Service History

He enlisted in the Kong's Own Scottish Borderers at Manchester, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 25 September 1915 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
