Personal History

John Herbert JONES was born at Liverpool, Lancahire in 1884 the son of Edward and Elizabeth JONES. In the 1911 census the family were living at 23, Copley Street, Everton, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 26 with the occupation of Railway Porter (Goods).

He was a married man. His wife's name was Isabella JONES (nee TURNER) They married at All Saints, West Derby, Liverpool on 16 May 1910. They had children: Irene Eliozabeth b. 11/05/1911, Arthur Cyril b. 16/02/1913

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Liverpool (North Docks) as a Gateman

Service History

He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Royal Rifles at Preston, Lancashire. on 20 September 1902 and embarked for on 13 September 1914. His last known address was Everton, Liverpool, Copley Street, 23 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 15 November 1914 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star

Transferred to Army Reserve 19/09/1905: Grave Inscription, "SACRED HEART OF JESUS HAVE MERCY ON HIM DEARLY LOVED SO SADLY MISSED"
