Personal History

Edmund Bradshaw BARLOW was born at Blackburn, Lancashire in 1896 the son of William and Ellen BARLOW nee BRINDLE who were married 1892 at St. Mary the Virgin (Blackburn Cathedral). In the 1911 census the family were living at 8, Winchester Street, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Cotton Weaver.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 5, Scotland Road, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 6 He was a married man. His wife's name was Florrie BARLOW (nee DEWHURST) They married at Blackburn Register Office or Registrar Attended on 28 March 1905. They had children: Edna b. 1914 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Burnley (East Lancs) as a Summer Collector

Service History

He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the East Lacashire Regiment at Accrington, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 18 August 1917 aged 21 He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
