***Personal History***

*Edmund Bradshaw BARLOW was born at Blackburn, Lancashire in 1896 the son of William and Ellen BARLOW nee BRINDLE who were married 1892 at St. Mary the Virgin (Blackburn Cathedral).*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 8, Winchester Street, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Cotton Weaver.*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 5, Scotland Road, Blackburn, Lancashire,. He was aged 6 He was a married man. His wife's name was Florrie BARLOW (nee DEWHURST) They married at Blackburn Register Office or Registrar Attended on 28 March 1905. They had children: Edna b. 1914*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Burnley (East Lancs) as a Summer Collector*

***Service History***

*He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the East Lancashire Regiment at Accrington, Lancashire.*

*He is recorded as Killed in action on 18 August 1917 aged 21*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal*
