Personal History

Thomas Ernest JONES was born at Burscough, Lancashire in 1898 the son of Thomas A. and Mary H. JONES.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Police Station, Penwortham, Nr. Preston, Lancashire,. He was aged 12 with the occupation of Scholar.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Turnpike Road, Burscough, Lancashire,. He was aged 2

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Timetaker

Service History

He was living at Horwich, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at the same place. on 2 June 1916 and embarked for France on 1 April 1918. His last known address was Leigh, The Avenue, 45 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died as a prisoner of war on 10 October 1918 in Germany aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
