Personal History

James BARLOW was born at Salford, Lancashire on 3 March 1893 the son of John William and Mary Jane BARLOW nee LALLY who were married 1877 at St Simon, Salford.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 34, Waterloo Street, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Labourer at Railway Works.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 34, Waterloo Street, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 8 He was a married man. His wife's name was Alice BARLOW (nee HARDEN)

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Salford as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Salford, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 26 September 1915. His last known address was Salford, Derby Street, Franklin Street, 50 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 9 April 1917 aged 24

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
