8021 (2nd) 3rd Battalion Lancashire Fusiliers

Killed in action 24 May 1915 aged 30

Personal History

Frank KENWARD was born at Lambeth, Surrey in 1885 the son of William James and Phoebe KENWARD nee BRIDGES who were married 04/10/1876 at Cornwall Road Chapel, Kensington, Middlesex. His mother died in 1892.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Depot Lancashire Fusiliers, Bury, Lancashire,. He was aged 26 with the occupation of Drummer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at Lambeth Old School, Elder Road, West Norwood,. He was aged 6 He was a married man. His wife's name was Louisa KENWARD (nee WAREHAM) They married at St. Paul, Bury, Lancashire on 13 December 1911. They had children: Harold b. 1913

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Bury as a Reserve Shunter

Service History

He was living at Bury, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Chatham, Kent. and embarked for on 7 October 1914. His last known address was Bury, Lancashire, Depot, Lancashire Fusiliers (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 24 May 1915 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
