Personal History

Richard KENYON was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1890 the son of Richard and Eliza KENYON nee CLAY who were married 1871 at St. Simon, Salford, Lancashire. His father died in 1945. His mother died in 1945.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Eliza KENYON (nee ROSS) They married at St. James, Collyhutst, Manchester on 22 February 1913. They had children: Alice b. 1913, Mary b.1916

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Stores Dept at Manchester (Osborne St.) as a Sheet Repairer

Service History

He was living at Manchester, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at the same place. on 5 September 1914 and embarked for France on 24 July 1915. His last known address was Collyhurst, Manchester, North Kent Road, 21 (Army Records).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 2 April 1916 aged 26

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
