## Personal History

Walter KNOTT was born at Newton Heath, Manchester in 1891 the son of John and Martha KNOTT nee ROBINSON who were married 07/06/1886 at St. Jude, Ancoate, Manchester. His father died in 1940. His mother died in 1940.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 1, Great Newton Street, Newton Heath, Manchester,. He was aged 19 Railway Eng Cleaner

In the 1901 census the family were living at 12, Great Newton Street, Newton Heath, Manchester,. He was aged 9

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Newton Heath as a Fireman

He was living at Newton Heath, Manchester when he enlisted in the Royal Engineers at Manchester, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 12 June 1915 in H.S. Grantully Castle aged 24 He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
