Personal History

James Harry Ormand LAMMIN was born at Louth, Lincolnshire in 1893 the son of John William and Sarah LAMMIN who were married 1880 at Louth, Lincolnshire. His father died in 1941. His mother died in 1941. In the 1901 census the family were living at Far Cott. He was aged with the occupation of South Ormsby. Age 7.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Cleaner

Service History

He was living at Louth, Lincolnshire when he enlisted in the East Lancashire Regiment at Burnley, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 8 July 1915. His last known address was Bin Brook Hill, Lincoln (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 22 March 1918 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
