Personal History

Thomas LATHAM was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1893 the son of Edward and Charlotte LATHAM nee HASSALL who were married 1873 at St. Mary & St. Nicholas, Nantwich, Cheshire. His father died in 1937. His mother died in 1937.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 5, Birley Street, Hillkirk St, Beswick, Manchester,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Railway Labourer - Brass Washer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 20, St. Andrew Street, Manchester,. He was aged 8
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon
Dept. at Salford as a Wagon Repairer

Service History

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 10 November 1915. His last known address was Beswick, Manchester, Hillkirk Street, Birley Street, 5 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 7 June 1917 in France aged 24 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
