Personal History

Patrick LAWLESS was born at Prestwich, Manchester in 1878 the son of Patrick and Maria LAWLESS nee LARKIN who were married 1876 at Salford Register Office or Registrar Attended . His father died in 1919. His mother died in 1919.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 8, Albert Terrace, Salford,. He was aged 32 with the occupation of Railway Carter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 48, Long Street, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Railway Carter.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 3, Harrisons Buildings, Salfiord, Lancashire,. He was aged 13 He was a married man. His wife's name was Margaret LAWLESS (nee CAIN) They married at Salord Register Office or Registrar Attended on 21 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Salford as a Carter

Service History

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire at Manchester, Lancashire. on 10 July 1896 and embarked for France on 29 November 1914. His last known address was Salford, Brigg Street, Francis Terrace, 9 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 15 August 1915 in France aged 36

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
