Personal History

Edward Thomas BARNES was born at Birmingham, Warwickshire in 1887 the son of Henry and Hannah Elizabeth BARNES nee BURFORD who were married 1880 at Aston, Birmingham.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 48, Holmsdale Road, Coventry,. He was aged 25 with the occupation of Coach Painter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 171, Ash Road, Aston, Birmingham,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Railway Carriage Painter.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Newton Heath Shops as a Painter

Service History

He was living at Saltley, Birmingham when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 29 August 1916 aged 29

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
