Killed in action 15 June 1917 aged 19

Personal History

LEACH was born at Horwich, Lancashire on 25 March 1896 the son of John Thomas and Caroline LEACH nee ATTWOOD who were married 1883 at Nantwich, Cheshire. Register Office or Registrar Attended . His father died in 1899. His mother died in 1899.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 44, Mason Street, Howich, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Locomotive Apprentice Fitter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 14, Taylor Street, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 5

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Apprentice Fitter

Service History

He was living at Horwich, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Bolton, Lancashire. on 17 April 1913 and embarked for France on 4 May 1915. His last known address was Horwich, Abraham Street, 36

He is recorded as Killed in action on 15 June 1917 in Festbert, France aged 19

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
