Personal History

Asa LEADBETTER was born at Maghull, Lancashire (Census) in 1894 the son of Joseph and Amy LEADBETTER nee NEWCOMBE who were married 1892 at St. Andrew, Maghull, Lancashire. His father died in 1951. His mother died in 1951.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 86, Babylon Lane, Heath Charnock, Lancashire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Creeler Mill Hand.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 5, East Avenue, Walton-Le-Dale,. He was aged 6

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich

Service History

He was living at Salford, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Chorley, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 25 September 1915. His last known address was Salford, Lynton Street, 24

He is recorded as Killed in action on 10 July 1916 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
