Personal History

G (James) Frederick LESSON was born at Horwich, Lancashire in 1898 the son of George and Ellen Jane LESSON nee MILTON who were married 1894 at Hoy Trinity, Horwich. Lancashire. His father died in 1952. His mother died in 1952.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 41, Webb Street, Horwich, Lancashire.. He was aged 13 with the occupation of Scholar.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 14, Stephenson Street, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 3 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as an Apprentice

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Bolton, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 6 September 1918 in 1st Aust Casualty Clearing Stn. France aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
