Personal History

John James BARNSHAW was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1896 the son of John James and Elizabeth BARNSHAW nee FAULKNER who were married 1892 at St Philip, Manchester. His father died in 1930. His mother died in 1930.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 6, Ward Street, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Hooker-on, Railway.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 171, Butler Street, Manchester,. He was aged 5

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. as a Capstan Breaksman

Service History

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 9 November 1915. His last known address was Manchester, Oldham Road, 6 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 11 June 1916 aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
