Personal History

Alfred LONGSHAW was born at Pendleton, Salford, Lancashire in 1895 the son of Charles and Elizabeth LONGSHAW nee RODGERS who were married 1879 at Christ Church, Salford, Lancashire. His mother died in 1918.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 51, Villiers Street, Pendleton, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Railway Office.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 56, Foundry Street, Pemdleton, Salford,. He was aged 6 He was a married man. His wife's name was Mary Francis LONGSHAW (nee CORCORAN) They married at Salford Register Office or Registrar Attended on 29 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Salford as a Clerk

Service History

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment. and embarked for France on 18 November 1915. His last known address was Pendleton, Salford, Milethorpe Street, 21 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 1 December 1915 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
