Personal History

Frederick William LUCY was born at Chelsea, London in 1880 the son of Thomas Ford and Louisa LUCY nee SCHUNTER who were married 1872 at St. George, Hanover Squsrem London. His father died in 1940. His mother died in 1940.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Langham Hotel, Portland Place, St. Marylebone,. He was aged 23 with the occupation of Cellarman.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Lucy Barrett LUCY (nee BAKER) They married at St. Mary Magdeline, Woolwich, Greenwich on 30 November 1902

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Hotel and Refreshment Rooms at Liverpool as a Waiter

Service History

He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Kings Liverpool Regiment at the same place. on 2 September 1904 and embarked for France on 7 November 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, Erskine Street, 32 (Service Record).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 29 May 1916 aged 36

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
