Personal History

Frank (Francis) LYNCH was born at Pendleton, Salford, Lancashire in 1898 the son of James and Lucilla LYNCH nee CARPENTER who were married 1895 at Salford Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1955. His mother died in 1955.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 44, Cook Street, Whit Lane, Pendleton, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Clog Makers Apprentice.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 20, Radford Street, Pendleton, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 4

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Agecroft as a Cleaner

Service History

He was living at Pendleton, Salford, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Royal Fusiliers (London Regiment) at Salford, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 17 October 1915. His last known address was Pendleton, Salford, Borough Street, 36 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 11 August 1916 aged 19

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
